♦ **MÓDULO 5 – REPARAÇÕES E COMUNIDADES IMAGINADAS: OS DEBATES CONTEMPORÂNEOS NA COMUNIDADE AFRO-AMERICANA NOS ESTADOS UNIDOS**

Prof. Dr. Michael Hanchard (Northwestern University)

This brief seminar is designed to familiarize Brazilian students with contemporary debates in U.S. politics and U.S. African-American political discourse over the historical legacy and present-day implications of racial discrimination, racial slavery and inequality in the United States. Utilizing methods of comparative analysis, students will consider these debates in cross-national perspective, focusing on themes of racial identity, the role of the state in racial formation and in the formulation of race-based policies, reparations and the transnational implications of U.S. African-American political ideologies and mobilization. Courses will be conducted in seminar format. The first half of each class will be in lecture form, followed by open discussion and formal presentation by students based on class readings.
